HEARING HEALTH DECISIONS

- IN THE US, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 29 MILLION PEOPLE HAVE DIABETES AND 8.1 MILLION ARE NOT YET DIAGNOSED DID YOU KNOW? Hearing loss occurs almost twice as often in adults who have diabetes than those who don't.
- IN THE US, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 37 MILLION ADULTS HAVE SOME DEGREE OF HEARING LOSS, WHILE 22 MILLION SUFFER FROM SOME FORM OF DEPRESSION.
 - **DID YOU KNOW?** Your ears can be a "window to your mind" and hearing loss may increase depression risk.
- RESEARCH INDICATES YOUR INNER EAR'S SENSITIVITY TO BLOOD FLOW MAY ENABLE HEARING LOSS TO BE AN EARLY INDICATOR OF AND SCREENING TEST FOR HEART PROBLEMS.
 - **DID YOU KNOW?** Your ears can be a "window to your heart" and that 600,000 die annually of heart disease in the US.

From the Audiologist: Healthy Hearing for a Healthy Brain

Until very recently, hearing loss was considered just another side effect of having more and more birthdays under your belt. In addition, making sure that you got treatment for your hearing loss was considered "elective" by many, including those in the medical community. However, new research has turned this idea on its head. Now, we know that your hearing health has a direct impact on your brain health. Audiologists have known for a long time that treating a hearing loss with hearing aids results in improved quality of life for our patients. They are able to be more active in their communities, and they are able to be more engaged in the activities they enjoy. They are able to communicate with friends and family and maintain these important relationships. With this new research, we now know that treating your hearing loss doesn't just impact your social life. It also results in improved brain health by reducing your risk of anxiety, depression, and dangerous falls. Perhaps even more importantly, the medical community has recently discovered that treating hearing loss can slow the progress of dementia by up to 70%! That's a fantastic breakthrough. Over the course of my first year here at Looper, I have loved getting to spread the word about all of the new advancements in hearing aid technology, such as smaller hearing aids, better sound quality, and cell phone connectivity. Now, I get to tell people all of the good things hearing aids can do for their brains! This year, we have helped more than 60 individuals take charge of their long term health and quality of life, and we look forward to helping many, many more in 2019.

Founded in 1969, LOOPER SPEECH AND HEARING CENTER is a private, not for profit 501 (c) (3) tax exempt organization, dedicated to meeting the speech, language and hearing needs of Northwest Georgia's children and adults. The Center is a direct service provider, an information resource center and an advocate for people of all ages who suffer from hearing loss, or have speech, swallowing and language disabilities.

In 2017, Looper Speech and Hearing Center provided over 9725 services. Of those services, 5670 were financially assisted to 538 individuals.

48% are older than 65,

71% are residents of Whitfield and Murray Counties

29% are from the surrounding communities


Income produced from Service Fees and Sales:


71% from Speech Services
